WORD OF LIFE

The History of Memorial Day: Originally called Decoration Day, from the early tradition of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths, and flags. Memorial Day is a day for remembrance of those who have died in service to our country. It was first widely observed on May 30, 1868 to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers, by proclamation of Gen. John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of former Union sailors and soldiers. In 1873, New York was the first state to designate Memorial Day as a legal holiday. After World War I, it became an occasion for honoring those who died in all America's wars and was then more widely established as a national holiday throughout the United States. In 1971, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act and established that Memorial Day was to be commemorated on the last Monday of May. Memorial Day is commemorated at Arlington National Cemetery each year with a ceremony in which a small flag is placed on each grave. Traditionally, The President or Vice President lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

The Diocese of Burlington: is publishing a revised 2018 edition of the *Policies on Ethics and Integrity in Ministry*, which comes out of the Office of Safe Environment Programs. These policy revisions were based on recommendations from our most recent audit in September 2017. Changes to the policies include updated terminology and additional provisions, among other small changes. All church personnel (as defined in the policy) must comply with these policies by following the proper protocol for child abuse training, background checks, reporting procedures, and more. This policy revision also includes updated versions of the two Codes of Conduct. The new policies and Codes of Conduct are incorporated into all Safe and Sacred training courses.
